- Tell, speak up to someone who can help.

Something Special Vocabulary for Beginning Readers

Basic vocabulary is necessary for a child as they begin to learn to read. Children learn the meaning of most words indirectly, through their everyday experiences. About 300 more words can be learnt each year as a result of direct vocabulary instruction. Basic vocabulary for beginner readers include: colours; prepositions; common objects and locations; pronouns; parts of everyday objects; adjectives; occupations; quantity words; materials; shapes and patterns. This activity can be done with two cups and any other single item you have on hand, e.g. a toy. Placing the toy in various positions relative to the cup/s, simply ask, "Where is ...?" If your child doesn't know the word, teach the prepositions through modelling.
