The amount of funding we receive for the 2019/20 academic year is £19,900. This amount has been boosted by an amount brought forward from 2018/19 in order to fund some of the more ambitious actions in our plans to develop a more active outdoor space. Consequently the amount of expenditure incurred during the year is in excess of the grant receive.

We are delighted to announce that we have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for 2018/2019. The School Games Mark is a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible. As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year.

Background:

The Government have provided funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2019 – 31 August 2020. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

The vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

OBJECTIVE: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity is increased.
- 2. The profile of PE and Sport across the school is raised.
- 3. Increase skills, knowledge and confidence of staff in teaching PE in sport.

- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
- 6. Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.
