## Something Special

- Visit the school together (GTKY Sessions)

- Drop your child off to transition morning
- Starting School books from the library
- Exciting trip to purchase uniform, shoes, coat, etc
- Buy clothes that are easy to put on independently
- Label EVERYTHING
- Read books to your child and talk about the pictures.
- Teach your child to use the toilet and wash hands independently
