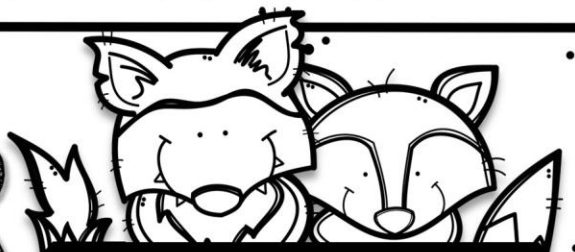

Dear Families,

Sun safety: why it's important?

The skin of children is more sensitive than adults, so using sun cream should mean less chance of causing irritation, and the higher SPF is a safer bet for their more delicate skin. Your child needs some sun to help their body to make vitamin D, which is important for things like strong bones and muscles but too much sun can lead to sunburn, skin damage, eye damage, etc. In addition to applying sun cream prior to coming to Brambles, you should ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the hot weather. Brambles supplies legionnaires hats so please dress your child in thin clothes which cover delicate skin. However our weather can turn quickly so please ensure you also provide a thin waterproof coat too, as we do go out in all weathers.
