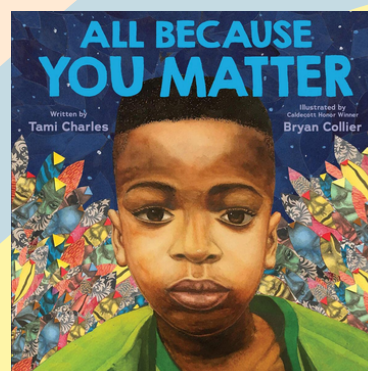
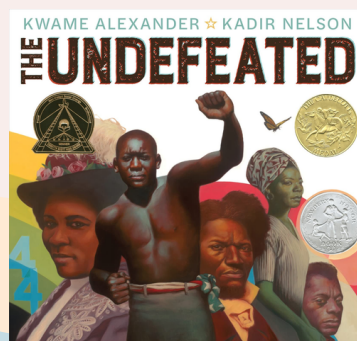
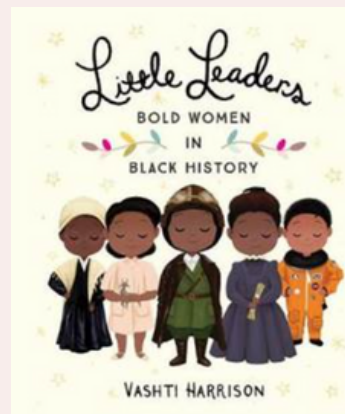
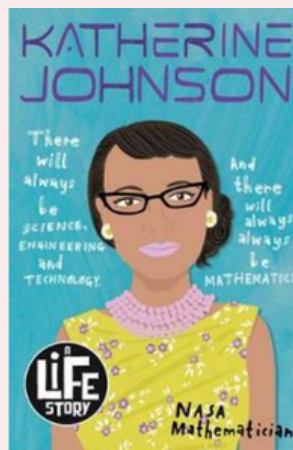


Current Events...

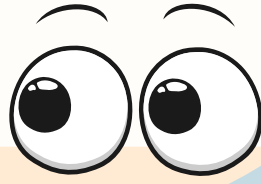
