Please encourage your child to read regularly, preferably daily, at home. The children are given opportunities to change their books every day usually first thing in the morning.

Please complete the reading diaries to show what reading has been completed at home. These will be checked regularly at school.

The children will continue to progress through the colour band scheme. Some children in Year 2, if ready, will progress onto the AR scheme.

We are fortunate to have volunteers from the community who will be reading with some of the children on a regular basis. These volunteers have been DBS checked. If your child is chosen to read with a volunteer then you will be informed.

<u>Homework</u>

Children will be set an open ended task every two weeks (approximately). Children will be given the opportunity to share their learning with their friends in class.

No jewellery except stud earrings and watches should be worn in school and these must be removed for all PE activities. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings, please remove the earrings in the morning, we are not allowed to remove children's earrings and they cannot be taped. Long hair should be tied back.
