Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Year 5! The following table allows you to see at a glance, our main learning foci for this term:

Topic	The Ancient Greeks
Subject	Main Learning Focus
English	Narrative – The Mysteries of Harris Burdick /balanced arguments/Myths & Legends/non-chronological reports.
Maths	Geometry – Angles, Properties of Shape, Measurement – Metric and Imperial, Perimeter, Area and Volume, decimals.
Science	Working scientifically: explore ideas and raise different questions; select and plan scientific enquiries  All Living Things – flowering and non-flowering plants; life cycles of plants.
RE	Creation stories
Computing	We are artists – creating tessellating patterns with Shodor and Transum programs
PSHE	Drugs education
Art and DT	Art: Greek pottery tiles DT: Wooden Trojan horses
Geography	Using atlas skills to locate ancient civilisations
Music	Learning songs and music for our summer production. 'Pirates of the Curry Bean'.
PE	Rounders, Tennis and Athletics
Modern Foreign Languages	Spanish: listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding; explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words; engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others.

Homework:

Learning Logs: Children will be provided with a learning stimulus linked to this term's learning on a Friday and will be

expected to bring their homework in on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday. As the children have additional time, there is an expectation that their homework should be creative and presented neatly. Please

encourage them with this homework.

<u>Daily Reading</u>: Children should be bringing home a school book to read. We do expect the children to read at home

on a daily basis for at least 20 - 30 minutes. However, this does not mean that you need to read with them, many children in Year 5/6 prefer to read by themselves, and you do not need to record what and how they have read. They may also read their own books, magazines or television guides!

Maths: Every fortnight, on a Friday, children will have a rainbow recall test which focuses on rapid recall of

mental arithmetic skills. Please encourage and support your child in learning their times tables. It is now a national requirement for children leaving Primary school to know all of their times tables.

<u>Spellings:</u> Look Cover Write Check spelling list will be sent out on a Friday and is due back in on a Friday.

Spellings will follow a rule or pattern and this should also be learned.

<u>PE days/kits:</u> These should be in school from Monday to Friday and should consist of:

Inside PE - a white t-shirt & dark coloured shorts

Outside PE - trainers, a white t-shirt, dark shorts, a sweatshirt and jogging bottoms.

No jewellery except stud earrings and watches should be worn in school and these must be removed

for all PE activities. Long hair should be tied back.
