One of our Teaching Assistants, Mrs Nash, has been appointed as one of our School Secretaries and she will be starting in the School Office from next week.






Bookings

Why is reading important?

Currently 1 in 5 children in England cannot read well by the age of 11. Research has shown that reading for fun improves literacy.

Embedding a love of reading in children can help their wellbeing in later life. 19% of adult readers say that reading stops them feeling lonely.
