Home Learning

The Local Authority recognises that home education rightly reflects a diversity of approaches and philosophies, ranging from a formal structured, time-tabled programme to a more informal, experiential approach to learning. Different approaches are relevant for the various age-groups but it is something that we are keeping under constant review as none of us know how long this situation will continue. Here are a few of the issues that have been raised:

- How should the children organise their time during the school closure? There is flexibility for parents and children to organise their weekly schedule in the way that best suits your family. Some have maintained their regular school timetables, whilst others fit around parents' home working and looking after siblings.
- Could we use video conferencing? Currently, we have decided not to use this facility for the following reasons:
 - Video conferencing works best for small numbers of participants, so everyone taking part has the opportunity to share their ideas. With large class sizes video conferencing could be a frustrating experience for children and cause them to feel discouraged.
 - Video conferencing requires a robust internet connection.
 - Video conferencing requires everyone to access at a shared time and this is not always possible for families who share computers for home working and home study.





 How long should children spend on their school work? We recognise that the experience of home learning is different to regular lessons, without discussion with the teacher and other children. Any timetables that are provided should be for guidance only as family circumstances will vary.

We have attached further resources to support parents and children at home. A supply of exercise books will be available from the main Reception area from 12.00pm on Monday.
