This week the children have been learning nursery rhymes and enjoyed "Mary, Mary Quite Contrary" with a potting shed role play outside, exploring soil in the tray and watering the flowers in the inside water tray, as well as painting with a fork to create flowers at the art table.

You do not need to go out and buy nursery rhyme books or CDs. Why not create some rhyming spoons at home this weekend?



They can be written on with a Sharpie pen or drawn. If you enjoy arts and crafts then you could get creative and make more elaborate spoons together.



Singing nursery rhymes and songs to children can help develop their language and communication skills from an early age. Introducing children to a variety of nursery rhymes can help them understand and learn about different sounds. This is an important part of developing those early literacy skills. Listening to different sounds in the environment as well as in nursery rhymes provides children with the foundations in helping them to read and write. As nursery rhymes are fun and full of sounds, children will tune into these sounds. Older children will experiment in combining sounds and blend them together to form a word.
