This Week's Learning

We have been learning all about the role of postal workers by writing our own letters and putting them in an envelope ready to post. We watched 'The Letter' from 'Come Outside' on YouTube and made our own role play post office, we created a story map from our two stories and we used our listening ears to listen to the environmental sounds on our walk to post our letters.

Something Special

The children have been chatting about starting reception and who will be in their class. It's okay not to be with their best or most favourite friend as they will see them before school, at playtimes, lunchtimes and in the shared areas within the reception wing. They will also be able to see their friends after school on the green or for play dates at home.

Preparing for reception emotionally:

- Practice putting clothes and shoes on & off independently
- Teach your child to use the toilet and wash hands independently
