## Home Learning:

Children will be set an open ended task every two weeks (approximately). Children will be given the opportunity to share their learning with their friends in class.

We were really impressed with the quality of the homework that the children completed in the autumn and spring terms. It was lovely to see the different and creative ways that the children tackled the tasks.

### Reading:

Children should be bringing home a school AR book to read. We do expect the children to read at home on a daily basis for at least 20 – 30 minutes. However, this does not mean that you need to read with them, many children in Year 5 prefer to read by themselves, and you do not need to record what and how they have read. They may also read their own books, magazines or television guides!
