# **Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding 2021/2022**

Current numbers on roll (nor) Reception – Y6 = 570

Number of children in Reception and years 1 – 6 who are eligible for Sport Premium on the January 2021 School Census = 533

The amount of funding we are receiving for the 2021/2022 academic year is £28,436. This amount has been boosted by an amount of £8,000 brought forward from 2020-2021 due to unspent money as a result of coronavirus. Consequently, the amount of planned expenditure incurred during the year is in excess of the grant we will receive.

Background:

The Government have provided funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport to schools. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2021 – 31 August 2022. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make a sustainable impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

### The vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is:

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

**OBJECTIVE:** To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

### Key Indicators We Are Aiming to See Improvement Against

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity is increased.
- 2. The profile of PE and Sport across the school is raised.
- 3. Increase skills, knowledge and confidence of staff in teaching PE in sport.
- 4. Broaden the experience of all pupils through a range of sports and activities.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
- 6. Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

#### During the academic year September 2021 to July 2022 we plan to spend our funding in the areas listed below:

\*The Hunts School Sports Partnership (HSSP) is a 'not for profit' organisation based at Hinchingbrooke School. The experienced and highly qualified team of PE specialist teachers work closely with schools across Huntingdonshire to support them in raising whole school standards in Physical Education and School Sport. HSSP also has extensive and established links with partner organisations; these provide enhanced opportunities for schools.

The subscription to HSSP has been increased to the highest level of support. Now we have a qualified PE teacher in for a full day each week, which will allow quality support to every year group in the school to promote best practice. This is very much in line with the idea behind sports premium, which is to providing sustainable improvements by upskilling school staff.

We have two PE subject leaders in school. One of our existing leaders left at the end of the last school year, and another has been recruited and enrolled on a PE leader's course. Supply to cover attendance on the course has been included.

We have run Balanceability for some years in school, and plan to continue this for Years 1 and 2.

HSSP run a variety of courses, to which we will have access as part of our subscription at no or very little cost. However, to attend courses we will usually require transport and supply cover for staff accompanying the children.
