Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Year 6! The following table allows you to see at a glance, our main learning foci for this term:

English	Non chronological text / Poetry / Diary / Biography / Narrative			
Maths	Place value, Addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and Geometry – Fluency, Reasoning, Problem Solving in each area of study.

Modern Foreign Languages	Spanish: listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding; explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words ; engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others.

<u>Home Learning</u>: Home Learning is set regularly and the children are expected to complete it in their own time. The following is a guideline for the type of home learning activities you may expect to see:

<u>Daily Reading</u>: Children should be bringing home a school AR book to read. We do expect the children to read at home on a daily basis for at least 20 – 30 minutes. However, this does not mean that you need to read with them, many children in Year 6 prefer to read by themselves, and you do not need to record what and how they have read. They may also read their own books, magazines or television guides!

<u>Spellings</u>: Each week children will learn 10 spelling words from the Year 5 / 6 Curriculum list. They will be tested on these words on Fridays.

<u>Maths</u>: Children will be asked to complete a task that helps them revise basic skills. Please help your child to learn their times tables - it really is essential for their progress in maths. Why not try rapping them as we have found they have enjoyed this when learning their rounding skills!
