#### Headteacher's notes...

We started the week with our termly Commendation Assembly where we celebrated and shared success with those children who received their Headteacher Certificates. Our 6Rs are an integral part of our school and we are always keen to recognise positive attitudes to learning, good behaviour, courtesy, consideration and responsibility. Congratulations to those who have received them.

Thank you for all the positive comments on the report slips that have been returned this week – we have enjoyed reading them. This week our Governing Body met for the last time this academic year and Rev Jason Taylor was elected as Chair for next year, with Emma Spencer as Vice Chair. At the meeting we looked at the results of the recent parent survey and I know that everyone at the school takes the views of all parents seriously. We greatly appreciate the support that we receive and are pleased that the overwhelming response showed that you have very positive feelings about the school, and that you feel your children are happy and making good progress in a caring environment. This year we received 49 responses and a summary of the responses is included at the end of this weeks' Newsletter. Following the resignation of Dave Freeman there will be a vacancy next term – please think about whether or not this is something that you could do. More details will be available in September.
