The Curriculum

- This term our topic is 'Decades of Fun' where children will be learning about leisure and entertainment throughout the 20th Century.
- In English each week children will be learning grammar skills, spelling rules and be given writing opportunities across a range of genres. This term they include: Narrative; Persuasion and News Reports. Time is also allocated for independent and Guided reading.
- In Maths this term we are following the new Mastery curriculum and will be covering Place Value, Additional, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division and Statistics.
- Science topics are: Forces in Action and Changing Materials.
- We also include weekly: Art, PE, PHSE, Music, MFL & Computing.



<u>Routines</u>

We now have a **whiteboard positioned outside the year 5 entrance**. We will be using this to update any information; give out notices; remind parents and children of clubs, PE timings, etc.

PE slots are on a Monday afternoon and all children are required to have PE kits in school for this time.

•<u>PE days/kits:</u> These should remain in school from Monday to Friday and should consist of:

•Inside PE - a white t-shirt & dark coloured shorts

•Outside PE - trainers, a white t-shirt, dark shorts, a sweatshirt and jogging bottoms – it can get very cold outside this term please make sure they have the last 2 items in their kit bags!!

•No jewellery except stud earrings and watches should be worn in school and these must be removed for all PE activities. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings, please provide tape for them to tape them up. Long hair should be tied back.



Expectations

Behaviour, Work & Attitude: At the beginning of each New Year the classes agree and sign a Class Charter. These are compiled by the children and state both their rights and responsibilities towards one another and adults in the school.

In addition, we operate a Traffic light Code of Behaviour where the emphasis is on positive behaviour recognised through class & whole school reward systems, e.g. Stars of the Week. There is also a graduated response to unacceptable behaviour & attitudes in class.

How you can help

At home:

- Ensure that your child is reading to themselves or to an adult for twenty minutes each day.
- Ensure that any home learning is supported (if needs be), completed and returned to school on time.

In class:

We very much welcome adult support. Please speak to one of us if you are able to help in any way.



Home Learning

- Reading: This should be done for twenty minutes a day.
- We are currently in the process of improving the way our children are given homework. We shortly hope to introduce some new and fun ways to learn at home.
- One of these ways will be the use of a Learning Log – for which a separate letter is being sent home.



Attendance and Uniform

- Please help us by ensuring that your child is on time for the start of the day: 8.45am. Lessons start at 9.00am.
- Requests for term-time absence should be in writing to the Head-teacher, using the form available from the Office or website. They are only authorised in 'exceptional circumstances'.
- Last year our attendance rate was 96.2%.
- Please also help us with school uniform and name everything.
