#### Headlice

We have recently been informed about cases of headlice across the school. It is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any headlice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread and the half term break provides a good opportunity for all families to do this.

As there have been cases, we suggest that you check your child's head as soon as possible. Here is some simple advice you may wish to follow to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

- ✓ Check your child's hair once a week.
- ✓ Use a proper detection comb with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice. The comb is usually white in colour so that lice can be easily identified.
- ✓ If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist and check the whole family.

#### Social Media

We have become aware of comments on social media from a few parents following this week's meetings with staff. Please can we remind you that the use of Social Networking sites such as Twitter, Instagram, Whatsapp or Facebook to comment openly on school issues or members of staff is not appropriate.

We hope you understand and appreciate our position on such matters and that you will support us by removing any comments of this kind. We are looking to maintain the strong relationship that we have with you as parents/carers and wish to work with you in the best interests of all children.

#### **School Attendance**

We recognise and appreciate the support that we receive from parents regarding attendance and that this term has been difficult with many illnesses about. However, a number of issues have arisen since September and we would like to clarify our procedures. As a school, we fully adhere to County Policy, which means that requests for leave of absence will only be approved in very exceptional circumstances and any unauthorised leave of absence may result in a Penalty Notice fine being issued.

We continue to receive requests for authorised absence during term time. Parents have a legal responsibility, as stated under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, to ensure that any child of compulsory school age attends the school at which they are registered, regularly and punctually. Along with all schools, we expect attendance to be 100%, unless there are exceptional or unavoidable reasons for absence, which would then be authorised.

The doors open at 8.45am and close when the bells ring at 8.55am, which is when school starts. If a child arrives after this time, they should come to the main office.

Children arriving late on a regular basis is also becoming more common. Sometimes there are very good reasons for a child arriving late but repeated unauthorised absence due to lateness meets the criteria to issue a fine in the same manner as general unauthorised absence from school.

We want to continue to work with families and if there are specific, concerns or issues please contact the school as early as possible so that any support or advice can be offered.
