



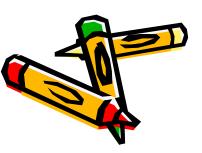
#### Safeguarding is effective. (Ofsted)

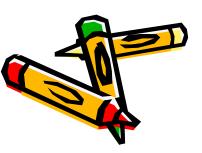
# First day at school! What will it be like?

- If it is upsetting we will ring to let you know they are OK



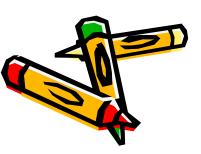
# How can you help at home?

- Label anything that can be moved!
- Encourage independent skills carrying own bags, dressing themselves etc
- Practice social skills turn taking, sharing, games school code is in the pack
- Practise toilet routines
- Make sure book bags are brought to school everyday, not ruck sacks please.
- Reading books and reading records should be kept in book bags



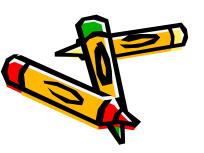
## School day

- We won't let them go until they can see you.



# Communication with Teachers

- There will be a member of staff on the door each morning for you to share any messages e.g. daily communication about collection arrangements, appointments etc
- Please share non urgent communication at the end of the day when its quieter.



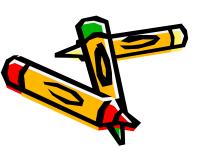
### Indoor Learning Environment

- Our Reception learning space is divided into key areas which is shared by all the classes.
- Each class has focused teaching sessions with their class teacher, but also move freely in between the three classrooms and outdoor area for continuous provision and child initiated learning.
- This allows greater social interaction and high quality provision in all areas of learning.




### **Outdoor Learning Environment**

- Forest schools



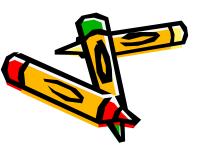
## PE

• This will start later in the year, so PE kits won't be needed to start with.



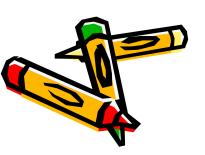
## Lunch time

## Toilets

- Children are reminded to go regularly but please help your child to go to the toilet independently.
- Any accidents dealt with sensitively.
- Please send change of clothes if there are any issues and let us know but we do have some spare clothes for emergencies.
- Practice washing and drying hands at home.



## Getting to Know You sessions and Transition Morning

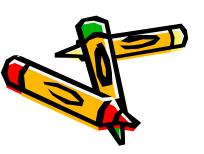
- We do not yet know what visits may be possible.

These may be done over Zoom.



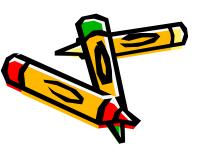
# Reading

- You will be invited to a meeting to find out more about reading towards the end of September.
- Children will bring picture books home at first.
- Reading scheme books will be sent home later.



## Homework

- We encourage children to bring any work done at home related to learning at school to share.
- Reading at least 3 times a week.
- We send home information about phonics (letter sounds) and maths concepts weekly.
