# **Year 2 Autumn Term 2021 Curriculum Letter**

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Year 2. The children have settled in brilliantly and we are looking forward to working with them and you during this academic year.

Dear Greenpeace (letter writing), Adventures of a plastic bottle (explanations), Queen Victoria's Knickers (narrative), The Ugly Duckling (traditional tale), Poems by Edward Lear.  Number and place value — Counting to 100, reading, writing numbers to 100 in numerals and words, representing numbers in different ways, Part-whole models, place value charts, comparing objects and numbers, counting in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s.  Shape and Space - we will recognise and explore the properties of 2D and 3D shapes including symmetry.  Addition and Subtraction - Number bonds to 10, 20 and 100, adding and subtracting 1s and 10s, Adding and subtracting two 2 digit numbers, adding three 1 digit numbers.  Statistics — Tally charts, Pictograms and Block diagrams with different scales.  Living things - Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults, find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).  Feeding and exercise - Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.  Who is Jesus? - Know that Jesus was an historical person, a 1st century Jew. Know that he is important to Christians who try to follow his teaching and example. Know that stories can be found about him in the Bible. Know some stories about Jesus and some stories he told.  Celebrations - Know the stories about Jesus connected with Christmas and the importance of these for Christians. Explore special times for Christians. Find out how Christians celebrate Christmas.  Robot Algorithms - describe and make predictions about a sequence of instructions, design algorithms for the Beebots, debug programs.  Programming in games - sequence instructions using blocks of code, design a background and sprite using Scratch.  Beginning and belonging - recognise what it feels like to be new in school, know who and what might help them if they are in a new situation, be able to identify adults who can help them if they are in a new	•			
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Family and Friends - describe some of the qualities of friendship and develop some strategies for coping when they have friendship problems, understand that friendships can change, recognise some similarities and differences between them and other children, describe what is special about their own family and its members, and about other people they know.  Antibullying - understand that bullying is deliberately hurtful behaviour, describe how it feels to be bullied, start to demonstrate simple ways of responding to bullying including by being assertive  Art — Exploring the life and artwork of Barbara Hepworth and creating our o sculptures inspired by her. Studying Turner, developing our brush skills and colonixing techniques. We'll also be sewing Christmas stockings.  Geography — Climate - Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK, identify the location of hot/cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator, North a South Poles, use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK, plus other countricontinents and oceans  History — Queen Victoria — We will be learning about what a Victorian childhood we like and about some Victorian inventions. We will find out about Queen Victoria and Mary Seacole.  We will have the opportunity to work towards a performance learning a stringed instrument or the recorder. In Beech and Willow they will be developing their previously learnt skills and using them to learn new pieces of music. Some children may have the opportunity to try the cello. In Maple Class will be developing previous learnt skills and applying these to learning the recorder. #### Reading

Please encourage your child to read regularly at home. The ideal is 5 times per week. During Year 2 the children continue to progress through the colour band scheme. Some children, if ready, will progress onto the AR scheme.

We will be sending home books twice weekly on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**. Please ensure that your child returns their books on these days. If your children finishes their book, it is good practise to repeat reading it in order to increase fluency.

#### **Reading Diaries**

Please complete the reading diaries each time you read with your child (try to complete one page per week). Your child can bring in their reading diary this year each time they return their book on Tuesdays and Fridays. More information about home reading can be found in the reading diaries.

### PE days/kits

Our P.E days are on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Please ensure that your child comes to school wearing their PE kit on their PE days. Suitable PE kit - trainers, a white t-shirt, dark shorts, a school sweatshirt and jogging bottoms. Please also remember sun cream, hats and water bottles (for hot days).

No jewellery except stud earrings and watches should be worn in school and these must be removed for all PE activities as it is no longer acceptable to use tape to cover earrings. This applies in both PE lessons and at any clubs.

We would therefore advise that children leave any earrings at home on their PE day. Any child who cannot remove their studs will be given another task to complete during the lesson. Whenever possible children should be able to remove their own jewellery before a PE lesson.

Long hair should be tied back.
