

Learning Goals:

Topic: 'Summer' **Main Texts:** 'Little Cloud' by Eric Carle and 'Little Cloud' by Ann Booth

We have learnt that clouds are a massive collection of tiny ice crystals or water droplets that are so small they float up into the sky. We also learnt about different types of clouds such as cirrus clouds - forming above 18,000 feet in the atmosphere; alto clouds - between 6,500 and 18,000 feet in the air; and stratus clouds - anywhere up to 6,500 feet. The different shapes of clouds also have different names too, which we got to explore at carpet time. We spoke about clouds look like shapes we know and how they change colour with the weather.
