Finally, I hope to see many of you at the Summer Fayre tomorrow. It's a wonderful community event and a great way to finish off what has been an absolutely fantastic half term.

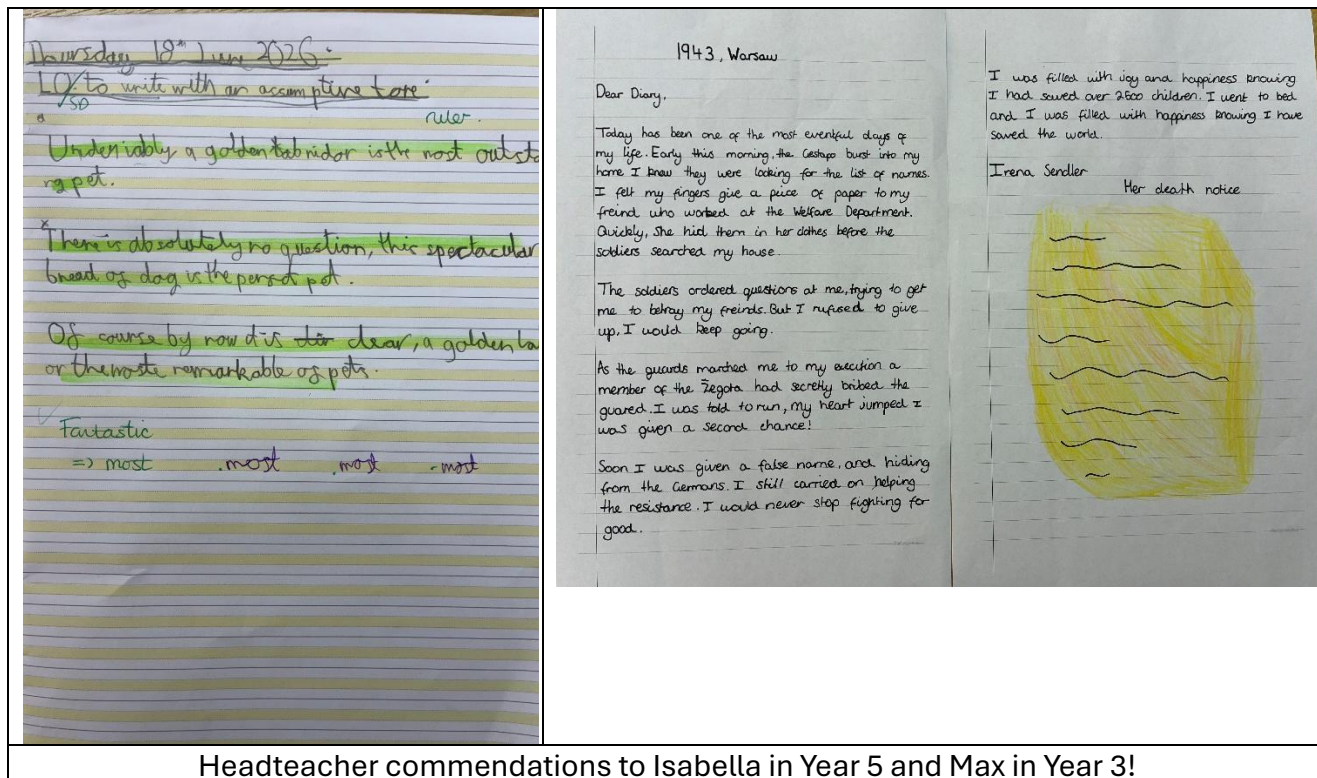

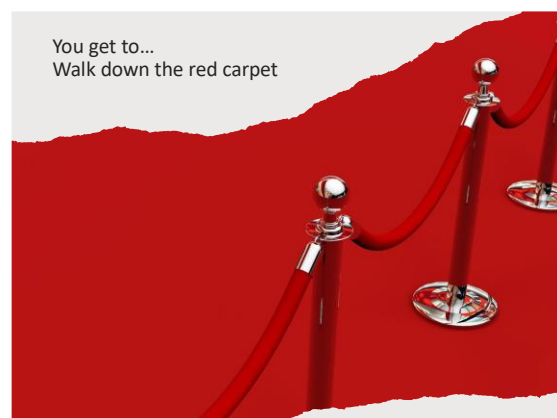
