

Den Building Resources



"I have enjoyed my time and feel really proud of the things I have achieved during this time. This included:

- Assisting Mr Allen and all staff to navigate through the strange times of Covid and lockdowns. This was in my first month as Chair!
- Being involved in a Local Authority Implementation Group in 2022 during which time the school improved
- Leading the Governors through the last Ofsted inspection where we gained a "Good"
- Being involved in recruitment of many staff
- Heading the Panel for the recruitment of the new Head (Chris Hill). This included taking potential applicants on tours of the school, writing the advert and application pack, shortlisting and devising and running the interview process.
- Being visible around the school and always willing to be a sounding board, give advice or just have a chat

I would not have continued for so long if I didn't have a fondness for the school, staff and pupils, wanting the best for them all. However, I believe that after over 5 years in this role, and with Chris Hill in place, now is the right time for a new Chair of Governors to take the school forward.
