Attendance

We all know that regular attendance at school is crucial if children are to achieve well and make the progress that we all want them to. Your support is much appreciated but there remain a number of children whose attendance has fallen below the acceptable threshold or who have a significant number of unauthorised absences.

Attendance is monitored regularly by staff as well as by Governors and our Local Authority Attendance Officer. As part of this we have to know where every child is every day so please help us by contacting the school office by either telephone (01480 375063) or email (pupilabsence@brampton.cambs.sch.uk) before 9.15am on each day of your child's absence. It is also essential that we have up to date contact details as well.

There has been updated advice issued by the UK Health Security Agency as Flu and coronavirus are currently circulating at high levels and are likely to continue to increase in coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, also continue to be reported.

It is important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.
